Some served by giving up their self identity and lying about who they are. Some were found out, and summarily fired. Too often while serving, with all of the weight of being part of a fighting force on their shoulders, they had no one to turn to for counsel nor pastoral care. I confess this evening: Some of these patriots were discharged after being "turned in" by their Chaplain - the very person who should have been a confidant, a counselor, a light, and a comfort. This is the day for us to let go of our grief, and bind our wounds. Let us rejoice and be glad in it.

WE GATHER THIS EVENING FILLED WITH HOPE, COURAGE AND COMMITMENT. May the repeal of the law and our gathering here tonight help restore integrity and honor to these brave men and women. May these patriots gathered here begin to breathe freely knowing that those who are serving have allies in the chaplain corps to which they can turn to and find the powerful presence of a loving, inclusive, accepting, living God. This is the day to celebrate our journey towards wholeness together: where we have come and where we are going. *Let us rejoice and be glad in it*.
